### Participants Requirements:

1. Be at least 13 years old by July 19th, 2009.
2. Be at least the rank of First Class.
3. Currently or soon to be a Troop Leader.
4. Obtain Scoutmaster's recommendation and Parents approval on the Participant's Application Form.
5. Provide a copy of BSA Personal Health and Medical Record.

### Cost:

The course cost is \$200.00 and includes all materials, t-shirt, food, insurance and program materials. Registration is limited to the first 48 participants, 30 minimum to conduct course. All registration material, medical forms, and fees must be received by June 19, 2009.

## What is National Youth Leadership Training?



NYLT is an intense youth-oriented leadership training experience.

## Who are the NYLT Staff?

NYLT is a boy run program with adult supervision. The youth staff consists of a Senior Patrol Leader, Assistant Senior Patrol Leader, and Troop Guides. The staff models the core learning and leadership messages of the NYLT syllabus.

## NYLT's Goal:

NYLT is an exciting, action packed program designed to provide youth members of the Boy Scouts of America with leadership skills and experience they can use in their home troops and in any other situations demanding leadership of self and others.

## Course Overview:

Built on the legacy of past JLT successes, the new NYLT integrates the best of modern leadership theory with the traditional strengths of the Scouting experience. Through activities, presentations, challenges, discussions, and audio and visual support, NYLT participants will be engaged in a unified approach to leadership that will give them the skills and confidence to lead well. Through a wide range of activities, events, games, and adventures, NYLT participants will work and play together as they put into action the best that Scouting has to offer.

NYLT models a month in the life of a troop. The course uses the patrol method and presents the model Patrol Leaders Council meetings. Patrols are challenged to present to the Troop their "Quest for the meaning of leadership" While the challenge is designed to have the patrols experience the four stages of development, it will help patrols and individual Scouts internalize the leadership skills and concepts being presented to them along the way. The patrols will be challenged with many activities and games. The focus of each session is, not only knowledge, but in giving the youth a "Toolbox of Skills" that equips them with the "how" of Leadership.



- Gives the participants the confidence and knowledge to conduct the troop program in their home troops.
- Provides participants with a clear understanding of team and personal development.
- Creates an environment of Scouting fellowship and fun guided by the Scout Oath and Law.
- Gives participants the opportunity to share ideas and experiences with Scouts from other troops.
